How to Dispose of Your Tree Limbs

Derby, Kansas – The June 23 storm left behind many downed trees and tree limb debris in Derby. Here are three ways for Derby residents to dispose of your tree debris:

1. **Waste Connections: FREE**

For the next two weeks, because of the storm, Waste Connections will allow you two pickup truck loads instead of the normal one at the transfer station. Even if you have already used one coupon at the transfer station since Jan. 1, until Sunday, July 7, you can get coupons for two pickup truck loads. You must call their office at 838-4920 (M-F 8-5) to get your coupon. The Waste Connections transfer station is located at 4300 W. 37th St. N. Trailers are not accepted, just pickup trucks.

Waste Connections Transfer Station Hours:

Monday-Friday 4:00 a.m. - 6:00 p.m.

Saturday 6:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. Sunday 8:00 a.m. - 2:00 p.m.

2. Waste Connections also offers curbside collection. You can use both coupons at the same time if you desire. Limbs must be cut to four feet and bound into 12 inch bundles. One coupon is good for five bundles, or two coupons allow for 10 bundles. You must call Waste Connections at 838-4920 (M-F 8-5) to schedule the pickup. Curbside collections will take some time. If your bundles are not picked up this week, they will get them next week. If the volume is too high, they simply cannot take everything on the first pass.

3. **Chip Site at High Park: FREE**

Hours: Mon.- Fri. From 7:15 a.m. to 3:45 p.m. & Saturdays 8 a.m. to noon

Drop off tree limbs up to 10" in diameter. Be prepared to unload the items yourself.

We appreciate your efforts to clean up your property and for helping your friends and neighbors.

“Reaching out to neighbors, family, church members and friends is important going forward as backyard tree damage isn’t obvious from the street,” said Kathy Sexton, City Manager. “All City crews are fully engaged in efforts to recover from the storm and restore City services.
